Spring Lake Regional Park Bow Hunt Approved

There will be a special bow hunt for deer conducted by the Scott County Natural Resources Department within Spring Lake Regional Park property from Sept. 25 – Oct. 4; Oct. 22 – Nov. 5; Nov. 27- Dec. 6. Scott County works with the Metro Bowhunters Resource Base which organizes the archers, ensuring proper training and experience. Signs are posted throughout the park at key access points to inform visitors of the hunt and hunt periods. The hunt is planned because deer can be destructive to adjacent properties if their numbers grow too large; moreover, they can constitute a hazard for vehicles.
