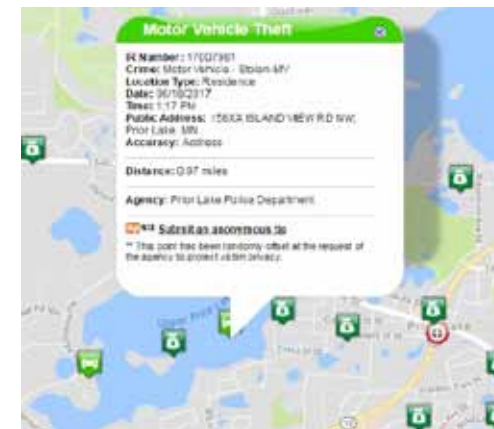

Interactive Crime Map Allows Residents to Sign-up for Alerts

In an effort to partner with the residents and businesses in our community the Prior Lake Police Department, in conjunction with Scott County has implemented a new crime mapping program from Lexis Nexis, called the Community Crime Map.



of crime, date and time of occurrence, and the block number. Traditional FBI part I and Part II crimes such as burglary, robbery, and theft are on there as well as other calls such as disturbances, DUI, and traffic stops.

The map also allows anyone to sign up for alerts and receive an email based on the types of call and area they are interested in. It also has a feature called tip411 which allows people to submit anonymous tips to the police. The map is available at the website www.communitycrimemap.com/.

CH 21 Downtown Reconstruction Project Update



There has been a lot of discussion among residents, business owners, staff, elected officials, and consultants regarding the County Highway (CH) 21 Downtown Prior Lake Reconstruction Project.

Since February, there have been two work sessions with Prior Lake and Scott County elected officials, one including public comments from residents and businesses. A Corridor Visioning Workshop kicked-off a series of public engagement events including four pop-up meetings at various locations/events around the city soliciting public input on the intersection and the CH21 corridor vision. Over 80 people attended the first Open House on June 29. In addition to this project, the Open House

included information regarding the City's Duluth Ave./TH 13 intersection improvement project as well as MnDOT TH13 project south of CH 21 - project teams are working together to coordinate the timing of these three projects.

Staff and consultants will be looking for more public input at another pop-up meeting at Lakefront Days August 3rd & 4th. Public engagement events will be ongoing throughout the project - keep an eye on the website, www.movingforward13-21.com, and the Facebook page for the most up-to-date project information, meeting times/locations, and to weigh in with your comments.

Speak Up Scott County, an online discussion forum, is up and running with discussion topics for the 13/21 reconstruction project. Elected officials, leaders, and staff want to hear your ideas and suggestions regarding current issues facing Scott County, Minnesota. Join the discussion!



Spring Lake Boat Launch will Close for Improvements

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources will be shutting down the Spring Lake public access in Prior Lake starting Sept. 6 and plans to have most work done and ramp open by Oct. 15. The project includes improvements to the storm water management, an aquatic invasive species boat inspection and cleaning area will be added, new (night sky friendly) lighting, new boat ramp, new bituminous for the parking lots, and shoreline restoration. During construction they plan to keep the ramp open as much as possible; however it will be difficult to predict which days will be open or closed, so plan accordingly. Utility E-billing: Convenient & Eco-friendly

What is E-billing?

- E-billing allows you to view your City of Prior Lake Utility bills online and make payments using a credit / debit card, electronic check, or ACH electronic debit.
- Once you've subscribed to E-billing, you'll no longer receive a paper bill in the mail. You'll be notified by email each time a new bill is ready to view. You can log in with a user name and password and view your current bills, and two years of billing and payment history.
- This system is completely paperless and provides you with the convenience of electronic payments. There is no additional charge associated with using the e-Bill service to view and pay your bills using electronic checks or ACH. A small fee applies when using debit/credit cards.

What is E-payment?

Garage Sale Sign Placement

- Not in the street right of way
- Place signs on the building side of curbs and sidewalks with permission from the property owner
- More than 50 feet from corners
- Not attached to street lights or utility poles
- Not on public property such as parks or City buildings
- May be displayed seven days prior to sale
- Must be removed immediately after the sale



Odd/Even Sprinkling Restriction May 1 - Oct 1

MY ADDRESS ENDS WITH AN EVEN NUMBER

Single family homes with house addresses ending in an even house number may water lawns or use an outside hose before 10 a.m. and after 5 p.m. only on even numbered calendar days.

MY ADDRESS ENDS WITH AN ODD NUMBER

Single family homes with house addresses ending in an odd house number may water lawns or use an outside hose before 10 a.m. and after 5 p.m. only on odd numbered calendar days.

Watering Ban
Everyday

May 1 - Oct 1

DID YOU KNOW:

Last year the three most common code violations were garbage & refuse, overgrown grass, weeds & brush, right of way violations. In total for 2016 there were 832 violations. These three violation types accounted for 340 violations.

Building and Structure Appearance and Maintenance Requirements

609.301: All building and structure exteriors shall be maintained in good repair, structurally sound and in a sanitary condition so as not to pose a threat to the public health, safety or welfare of other property owners.

609.302: All buildings shall have complete siding. Every exterior wall shall be free of holes, breaks, loose or rotting boards or timbers, or falling or loose stucco or brick with an area of one square foot to prevent vermin, mold, rot, deterioration and other structural damage and to protect the value of properties.

609.304: All doors, windows, and gutters shall be operable and maintained in good repair, shall fit within their frames and shall be free of open breaks or holes in order to prevent vermin, mold, rot, deterioration and other structural damage, to maintain energy conservation, and to protect the value of properties.

609.305: Fences, retaining walls and landscaping shall be maintained so as to prevent health hazards, or unsafe conditions.

1107.1909: Maintenance Standards
All cultivated landscape areas shall be maintained to present a healthy, neat and orderly area, including:

- Maintain a healthy, pest free condition.
- Remove dead, diseased or dangerous trees or shrubs.
- Mowing and/or removal of noxious weeds and grasses.
- Remove trash and other debris.
- Watering to ensure plant growth and survival.

Remove Grass and Leaves from the Street



601.201 No person shall throw or deposit litter in any street, sidewalk, sewer, storm drain or other public place within the City except in public receptacles or authorized private receptacles for collection.

Tall Grass and Weeds (609.701):

Grass and weeds should be maintained to a height of 12 inches or less. It is the responsibility of the owner, lessee or tenant of the property to trim any grass and weeds. This ordinance is enforced from April through October of each year.
