GOAL: ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP & RECREATION

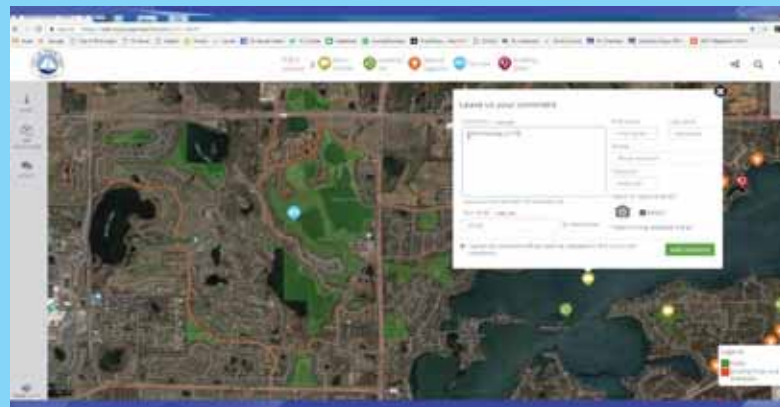
Objectives:

City Code Reminders:

Riparian property owners, did you know that renting out boat slips is a violation of City Code? Unless specifically permitted as a commercial or recreational marina, commercial uses, including but not limited to leasing or rental of dock space, are not permitted in residential districts.

Certain seasonal structures are permitted for a limited time period. Before constructing or purchasing a seasonal structure read the code requirements below and please note not all temporary structures are able to be permitted. Seasonal structures constructed or purchased without a permit are in violation of city code.

1101.510.4 **Seasonal Structures.** A structure or land in any Use District may be used for one or more of the following temporary uses:

- Only for uses permitted within the Use District.
- Shall not be permitted for a period of more than 6 months.
- Shall not be permitted within 15 feet of any public right-of-way.
- No significant trees shall be removed for the placement of a seasonal structure.
- Any landscaping material which is displaced shall be replaced upon removal of the seasonal structure.
- Seasonal structures shall not be permitted in any required buffer yards.
- Approval of a site plan is required prior to the placement of any seasonal structures.

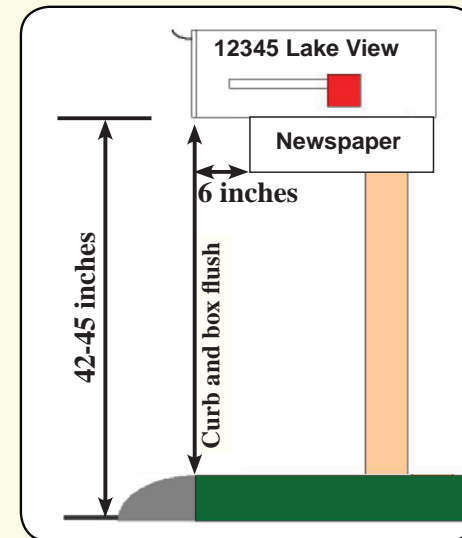

Check Your Mailbox Location Before Winter

The Prior Lake Public Works Department would like to remind residents to check the location of mailboxes before winter hits. Any mailboxes under 42 inches and hanging over the curb could be struck by a snowplow blade. Be sure your mailbox meets the following criteria:

1. Front of mailbox should be flush with the back of the curb and 42" to 45" from the top of the curb to the top of the mailbox.
 2. Newspaper boxes and other containers should be set back a minimum of six inches from the back of the curb. The post should be set back a minimum of 12 inches from the back of the curb.
- NOTE: The city's policy is to provide mailbox replacement up to \$50 only if the box that is struck is located within the above guidelines.
